Key Vocabulary

Christianity: A religion based on the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Forgive: To stop being angry with someone who has done something wrong.

Sin: Bad things people do that makes God sad.

Salvation: The saving of a person from sin or evil.

Reunite: To come or bring together again after being apart.


Crucifix: A representation of a cross with a figure of Christ on it.

Passover: A Jewish festival - Jesus celebrated this with his disciples at the Last Supper.

The Eucharist: A Christian service commemorating the Last Supper.

Palm Sunday

Jesus travelled into Jerusalem on a donkey as was foretold by ancient prophecies. As he entered the city people threw down palm leaves and shouted 'Hosannah!'





The Last Supper

Jesus celebrated Passover with his disciples in Jerusalem. It was the last meal they shared before Jesus' death. Jesus passed around unleavened bread and wine saying that they represented his body and blood. Christians still remember that today in the Eucharist.


Good Friday

Jesus was arrested in the garden of Gethsemane and sentenced to die on a cross.

Christians believe that Jesus died so that mankind could be forgiven of all their sins and be reunited with God. Jesus' sacrifice was made to save all humans.

Jesus said, 'Forgive them Lord, for they know not what they do', when he was on the cross, praying for his tormentors.





Easter Sunday

After Jesus died, he was taken down from the cross, his body wrapped and placed in a tomb. A stone was rolled in front of the entrance.

Mary Magdalen went to visit
Jesus' tomb and found it empty.
An angel appeared to her and told
her that Jesus had risen. Jesus
was then seen by his disciples for
40 days before he ascended to
heaven.
